PGK NOVEMBER MEETING

The PGK NOVEMBER meeting will be held on WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 18, at 17:45 PM and will be preceded by aperitifs from 17:00 PM onwards. The lecture will be held at the KIVI building, Prinsessegracht 23, The Hague.

Mr D.A. Nieuwland of Shell Research and Technology Services will speak about: 'An integrated general approach for trap integrity'.

The speaker has provided the following abstract:

In order to optimise reservoir management, gas utilisation and to minimise environmental damage related to E&P activities, reinjection of gas is an increasing practice. To enable safe operations, a study was undertaken to develop a general method for quantitative determination of the strength of faults and top seals of hydrocarbon accumulations in relation to reservoir pressure increases due to gas injection. When injecting gas into a reservoir, the pressure will rise. In most cases the elevated pressure will not exceed the initial reservoir pressure, however, post-injection pressures in excess of the initial pressure may well occur. The in-situ stress history of a particular structural configuration is also important, pressure decrease followed by an increase on one side of a fault, has a different effect than a simple pressure increase. Cap rocks or fault seals may leak either by diffusion, by capillary leakage or by mechanical break down. Methods to assess the likelihood of the occurrence of each of these processes and to quantify the results, are discussed and are used to design a general approach. For a quantitative analysis it is necessary to have access to core material and a sonic log. Once a sonic log has been used for geomechanical analyses and calibrated against core data, one may do without a core in nearby fields in similar lithologies.
